Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us ... pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints.

Halloween (All Hallows Eve), All Saints Day, All Souls Day...

If you have an investigative mind and would like to embark on a scavenger hunt, any of these days will give you plenty to dig for. Their history reaches back, not only to early Christianity but to sacred days that existed prior to the church (which the organized church later claimed as its own). Today we tend to celebrate these days as a remembrance of loved ones who have died but whose love for us (and our love for them) continues.
