It doesn't interest me what you do for a living. I want to know what you ache for, and if you dare to dream of meeting your heart's longing. I have faith in longing, wherever it finds me. And often it finds me at unpredictable and inconvenient moments. It's like a door that suddenly opens. I am never prepared. There is no preparation for the way it takes me and leaves me, for the fierceness of the ache. Sometimes we blame someone else for denying us some choice or other. Sometimes we soothe ourselves with stories of how long-suffering, or self-sacrificing, or altruistic we are. But the truth is that we are choosing - every day, every moment, every breath.

But if we stopped and sifted and sifted through the sands of our lives, once we shook out all the unneeded stuff, there in the bottom of our sifting screen would be these little nuggets that we never saw before; the precious metals of our desires and dreams and shy souls. Oriah encourages us: "Speak the unspeakable, hear what your heart and soul most long for, without judgment. Surprise yourself. Tell yourself something you do not already know."
